FISCAL RESPONSIBILITY*

1995-2005

- 3 tax increases. 39.9%, 18.2% & 33.9% = 92%
- Inflation during the same period 30.94%

2006-2024

- 3 tax increases 6.3%, 3.9% & 8.9% = 19.1%
- Inflation during the same period 54.69%


